

### INTRODUCTION TO THE COURSE

The title of this course has been inspired by the old Northern saying, "Where there's muck - there's brass". This was applied to people, or more commonly communities that got their hands dirty and in so doing made money! Sadly, that wasn't always the case. There were many such communities where the workers were best described as "dirt poor", only the owners made money.

This course, is being presented in two parts, with Part 1 in 9-weeks this Autumn and a further 8-weeks in the New Year.

- **Unit 12: Black diamonds** - coal mining the length and breadth of the country
- **Unit 13: Oil & gas from land & sea** - the ups and downs of a twentieth century industry
- **Unit 14: Water, water everywhere** - it's all about storage and distribution



- **Unit 15: Clays for each & every occasion** - an industry with a past and a future
- **Unit 16: Rockstars** - valuable rocks for constructions and monuments
- **Unit 17: Geotourism** - the new kid on the block

#### **PRACTICAL POINTS**

- To do this course electronically you'll need a computer or tablet with access to the internet. You'll also need a valid email address - please supply it at the time of enrolment. Units will be sent as pdf files. A broadband connection would be very helpful, but is not essential.
- To access Moodle, Colin will give you some simple instructions and a password.
- If you want to take part in our live Zoom presentations, you'll need to fit a camera and microphone to your computer. These can be purchased at very reasonable prices online and are easy to fit and use. Alternatively, you can use a tablet or iPhone

*Weekly live Zoom meetings will take place during the course at 2 and 7 on Mondays.*
